

> Between September 2020 and August 2021, we sent 85 tons of medicine to 73 countries, reaching an estimated 6.36 million people. Fortunately in fiscal year 2021, we saw an increase in traditional medical mission trips, though we've yet to return to pre-2020 numbers. Developing nations are still greatly impacted by the health and supply-chain affects of the pandemic. At a time when many overseas pharmacies are stripped of items, the orders we've exported and the teams who have been able to travel have literally saved lives.

HUMAN TREATMENT VALUE FOR MEDICINES SHIPPED

In FY 2021, the human treatment value (HTV) of the medicines we shipped was **74,759,177.** That is over **74 million** courses of medicine and vitamins Blessings International shipped to medical teams, clinics, and hospitals to 73 nations, including within the United States. The chart on the opposite page details exactly how many dosages went to each country. (Please note, some countries were sent medical supplies and personal protective equipment [PPE] only. Because these items are not assigned a human treatment value, they have been marked PPE.)

HTV is our measurement for the number of lives affected by a product ordered through Blessings International. It is measured by totaling the number of medicines shipped that fall into one of two categories: curative treatments and treatment


> Curative treatments are defined as one full dosage of a treatment, regardless of how many individual pills/tablets/injections are required. For example, one course of antibiotics to treat an infection may require multiple tablets given to a patient over multiple days, but for HTV accounting purposes, it will only be counted as one treatment. Curative treatments include items such as antibiotics and anti-malarials.

Treatment days are defined by the number of days a medicine is used. Total treatment days are the number of pharmaceutical dosages that are used to treat acute or chronic issues (including items such as analgesics, vitamins, antihypertensives, etc.) For example, if Blessings ships a bottle of 500 vitamins and someone takes one multi-vitamin per day, that bottle will equal 500 treatment days.

Out of FY 2021's total human treatment value, **4,003,403** were curative treatments and 70,755,774 were treatment days. With the medicines Blessings International shipped in FY 2021, an estimated 6,361,929 people were treated.





Our fiscal year continued to be financially impacted by the uncertainties and restrictions caused by the prolonged pandemic. In FY 2021, we mitigated losses and stabilized our position for future growth, while continuing to utilize 100% of every donated dollar to support benevolence projects (detailed on pages 8 through 10).

Because transparent integrity is one of our core values, we are open and honest in our operations, transactions, and dealings, from our finances to our communications. Blessings International undergoes a financial audit each year by an independent public accounting firm. This independent auditor also prepares our IRS Form 990, which the graphs below are based upon. BLESSINGS INTERNATIONAL FISCAL YEAR 2021 FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT




PRODUCTION REPORT

Blessings International's production department is responsible for rebottling, repackaging, and relabeling items that we purchase directly from manufacturers and other pharmaceutical entities both in the United States and abroad. Blessings is licensed by the US Food and Drug Administration as a repackager and is authorized to import medicine and medical supplies for exportation.



In FY 2021, our MRS (medication repackaging service) saw an increase from last year. We were also able to produce more Blessings care kits in FY 2021. Care kits were introduced in FY 2020 and were designed for meeting a person's basic needs during times of upheaval, when resources are minimal, such as after a natural disaster. Each kit contains a towel, body wash, toothpaste, toothbrush, comb, antibiotic ointment, and adhesive bandages.

BENEVOLENCE PROJECTS

COVID-19 Relief

\$24,141 distributed

For the second year in a row, COVID-19 has continued to impact our lives and our world. Throughout 2021, Blessings International remained a stable source for PPE and crucial medicines for US charitable clinics, using the COVID-19 Relief fund to alleviate customer's costs of these items when possible.

As society has adjusted to a life within a multiyear pandemic, it has become obvious the need to efficiently diagnose and treat COVID-19. That is why Blessings utilized donations to contribute toward the purchase of a GeneXpert machine for the Wycliffe Clinic in Papua New Guinea. The GeneXpert machine allows for diagnosing COVID-19 and tuberculosis, both diseases that are prevalent in PNG. One individual from Wycliffe said the machine allowed their team to "accurately diagnose COVID-19 and protect the larger public by focusing [their] time on educating those who test positive."



When international travel paused in 2020, Blessings' warehouse remained fuller than expected. As time passed, expiration dates became closer and closer. Because Blessings did not want these supplies to go to waste, this special fundraiser was created so we could provide quickly expiring vitamins to pregnant mothers and children around the world.

The Expedited Hope fund was created as an expansion of Supplication for Supplements to include all short-dated medicine, not just vitamins. One major beneficiary was Venezuela, as a local church, South Tulsa Baptist Church, was regularly able to receive the short-dated items and distribute them to those in need in Venezuela.



Medicines for Orphans

\$43,800 distributed

Meeting basic needs can be a huge battle for orphanages. And providing anything beyond that can feel nearly impossible. That is why, for the fifth year in a row, Blessings continued to provide the Haitian Orphanage Medical Support fund.

HOMS director Debi Lammert, APRN-CNS says, "The HOMS project continues to shine like a bright flame in the sea of darkness that is Haiti at this time. The HOMS project sees the vulnerable children and their caregivers as individuals worthy of value and attention. By our words and our actions, we show them Christ personified. A smile, a kind word, saying their name, a gentle touch while doing a height and weight check, a small treat during the visit—each of these things conveys love and respect to children that have and get so little. The more difficult the circumstances, the brighter our HOMS small light shines."

Emergency Disaster Relief

\$22,593 distributed

Throughout the year, we continued to provide support through our Emergency Disaster Relief fund for Lebanon, Cuba, and Venezuela, as well as relief for natural disasters. Most significantly, we were able to aid those responding to the St. Vincent and Grenadine volcanic eruptions, Hurricanes lota and Eta, and the Haiti earthquake.

Within one week of the August 14 earthquake in southern Haiti, Blessings received over \$18,000 to aid teams responding to the disaster. Thanks to donations to the Emergency Disaster Relief fund, approximately 44,000 lives were impacted by the medical supplies we sent in response to the earthquake.

Malaria

\$13,017 distributed

Malaria is one of the world's deadliest diseases, despite being completely treatable if the right medication is available. That is why, during the months of April and May every year, we freely offer antimalarial medicine for mission teams to distribute to areas where malaria is a daily concern. This year, we were able to offer \$13,000 toward defeating this disease.

It's our pleasure to support clinics and hospitals across the country and the globe. Funding for clinic/hospital and ministry support comes from the Medicines for Nations fund as well as funds like Bless the Nations.

Medicines for Nations - \$133.839

Medicines for Nations is a multipurpose fund, from which we are able to bless an array of organizations, ministries, and clinics/hospitals.

Bless the Nations - \$17,529

Bless the Nations is a grant which organizations can apply for. A committee consisting of some of our board members review applications and choose recipients, who receive the funds in the form of account credit. One recipient, Clinica Esperanza in Roatán, Honduras, says the grant was critical in helping them aid the island during the pandemic when needs were overwhelming and shortages frequent. "The grant was a huge blessing and came at a time when it was most needed. To your donors, I would say, 'Thank you and God bless each and every one of you. You saved many lives through this grant."

Ministry Support - \$21,500 nationally and \$16,600 internationally


